Summer and Dog's Overheating




In a short amount of time an overheated dog can suffer critical damage to the brain, heart, liver and nervous system.

Breed of the Month - Tonkinese (AKA "The Tonk")

Personality:

Tonkinese cats are a result of crossing the Siamese and Burmese breeds and the result is a friendly, outgoing, and active cat. They will welcome your guest and if they are not riding on your shoulders they are playing fetch, sitting in your lap, or just chatting with you about the day. With this friendly outgoing personality they are a good choice for families with children, other cats and cat friendly dogs. If you are looking for an aloof independent cat this breed would not be for you. They demand you to love them! They are curious and will get into things you preferred they didn't. The Tonkinese likes toys and high places. They are a natural in inventing and playing games. The Tonk does not like to be alone for long and will get into mischief if it is bored too often. Being one of the most playful breeds of cats it needs to play. So if you are gone a long period during the day you might want to consider a second Tonkinese to keep each other company and for them to play. One of the articles said they have no health problems.
